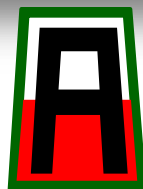

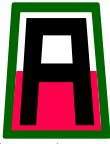

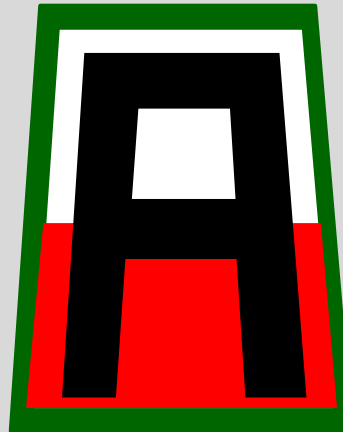




# Mission Statement

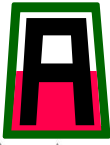

- Validating the Operational Reserve for Distributed Non-Deploying Units and Regionally Aligned Forces (RAF) Employment

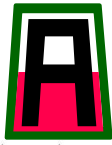

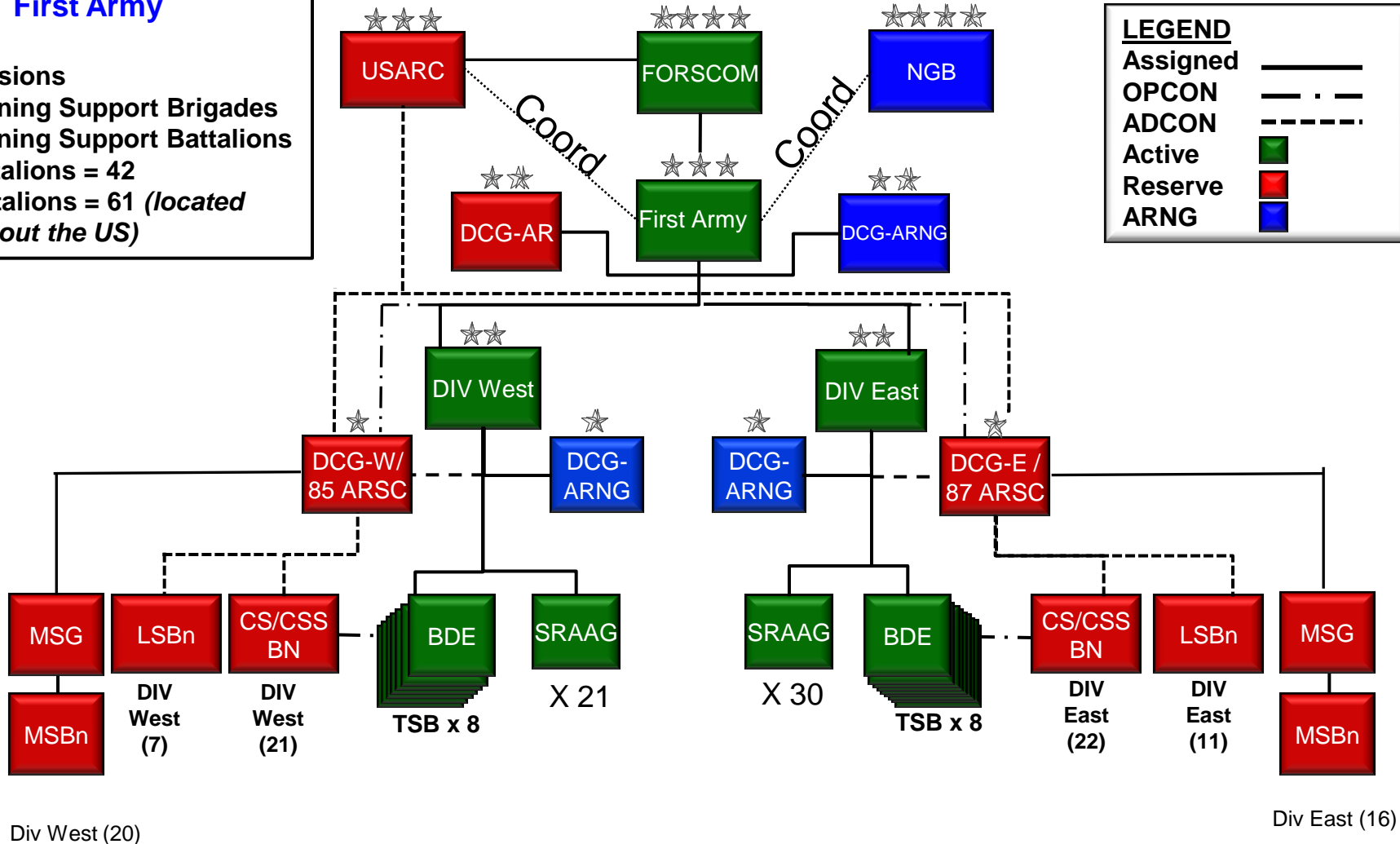

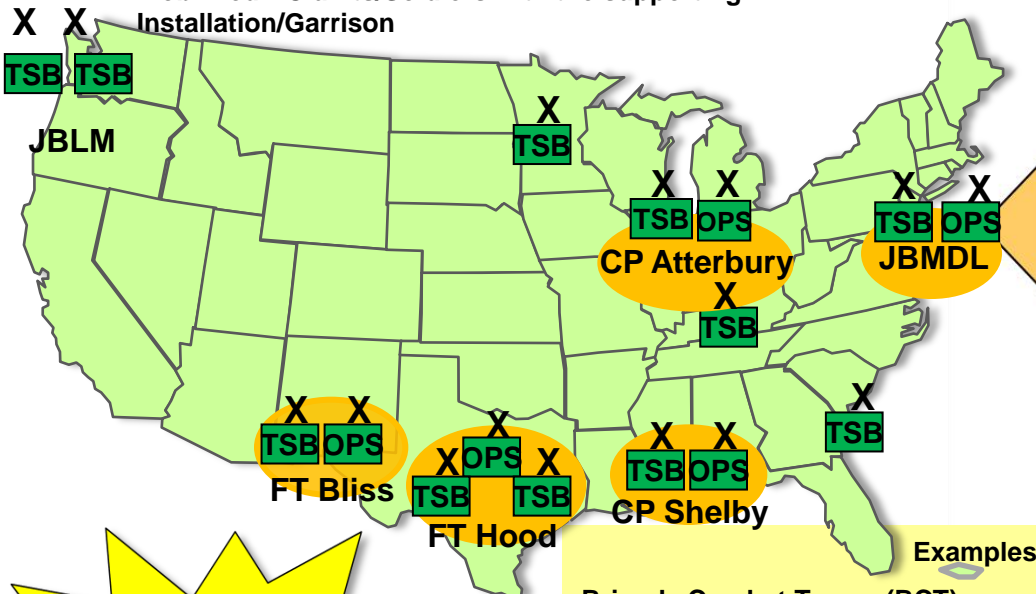
# What We Do and Where We Go...



## Mobilization

We Mobilize, Train, Validate, Deploy and Demobilize Reserve Component (RC) Units and Soldiers:

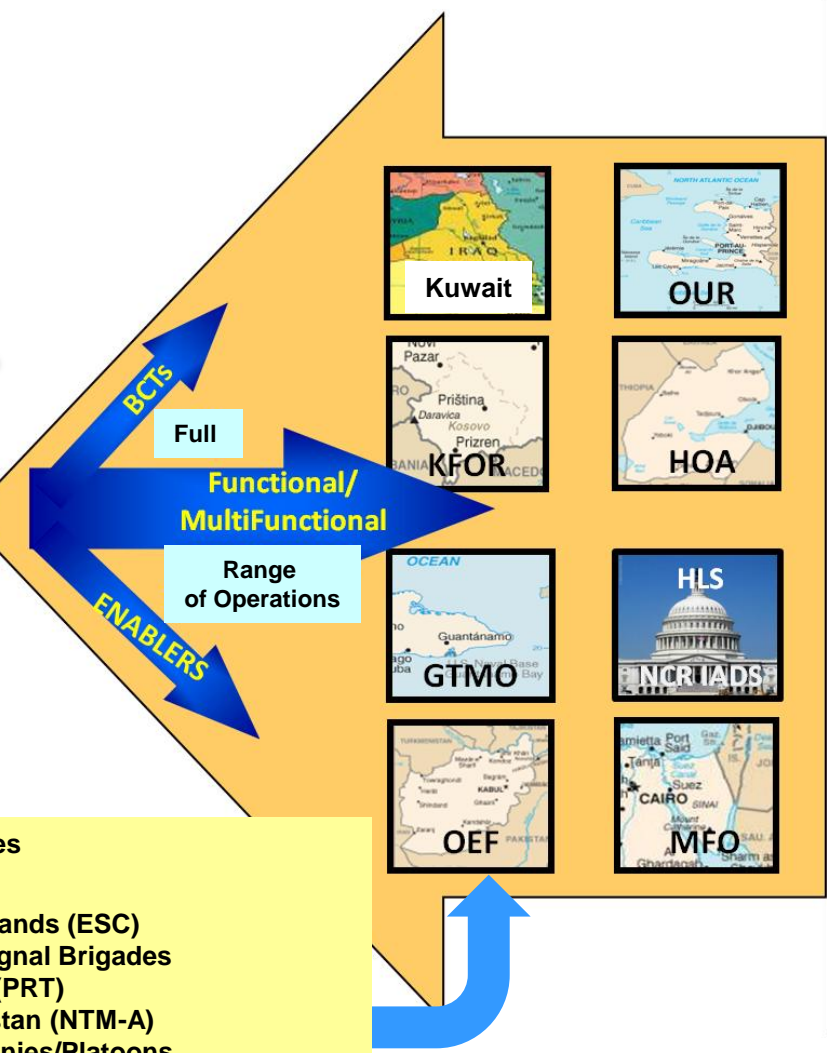
- When RC units/Soldiers are mobilized for Active Federal Service under Title 10 USC
- Upon Mobilization .... RC units and Soldiers are Attached to First Army
- First Army shares Administrative Control (ADCON) of mobilized RC units/Soldiers with the supporting Installation/Garrison

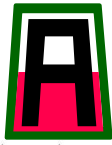

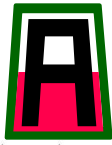


# ARFORGEN Training Model

 UTA = Unit Training Assembly





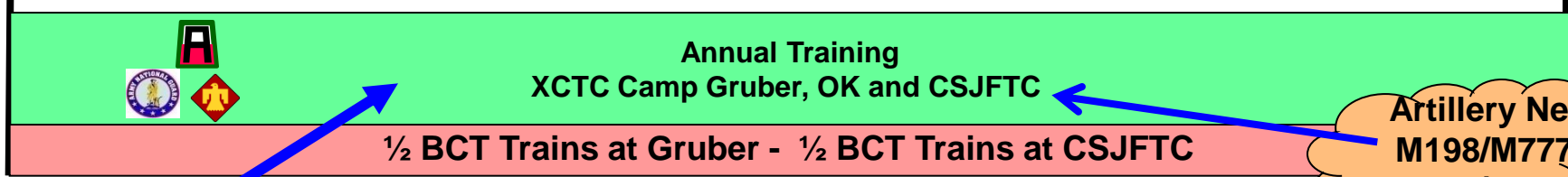

# Requirements-Based Demobilization Model

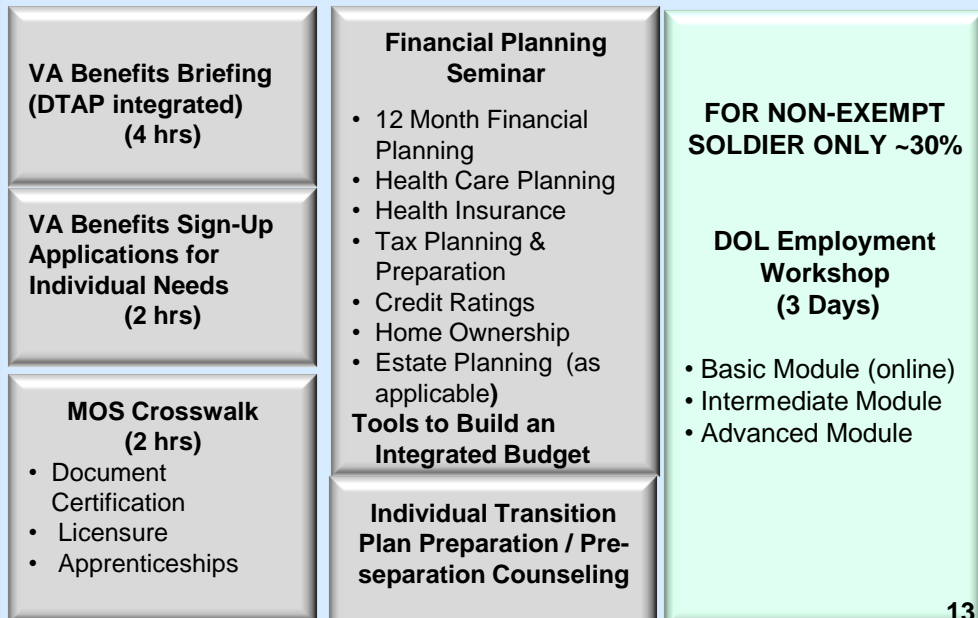


## Concept of Operations

- Engage Unit Leaders in Demob Planning, Prep & Execution from Joint Assessment (JA) to REFRAID
- Establish Deployment Support Cells (DSC) at Demob Stations (DMS)
- Continuously Assess & Refine Soldier's:
  - "Path of Care" requirements at DMS
  - "Continuity of Care" requirements at HS
- Iterate Demob Validation & Assessment

- Mobilization Load - 31,000
- Demobilization Throughput - 29,600
- **Total Mission Load: 60,600**





# Regionally Aligned Forces



**Purpose:** Regionally Aligned Forces provide the COCOM with up to Joint Task Force capable headquarters with scalable, tailorable capabilities to enable him to shape the environment.

**Forces:** Those Army *units*:

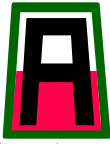
- **assigned** to combatant commands;
- **allocated** to a combatant command; and
- those *capabilities* **distributed** and *prepared by the Army* for COCOM regional missions.

**Includes:** Army Total Force organizations and capabilities which are:

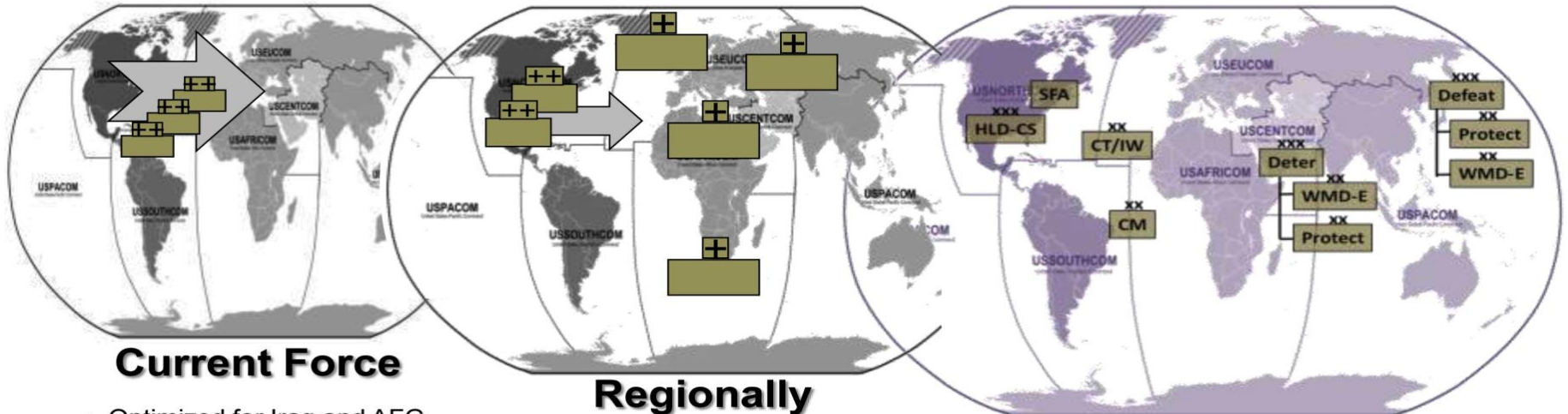
- forward stationed;
- operating in a combatant command area of responsibility; and
- supporting from outside the area of responsibility. (reach-back; support from outside the AOR)

**Mission Set:** Regional missions are driven by COCOM requirements, & includes:

- an understanding of the cultures, geography, languages, and militaries of the countries where they are most likely to be employed; and
- expertise in how to impart military knowledge and skills to others.

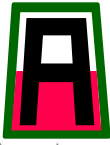
