History

- International cadets have been at West Point since <u>1816</u> and program officially began in <u>1884</u>
- Prominent International Graduates
 - Former Nicaraguan President Anastasio Somoza, Jr., Class of 1946
 - Former Philippines President Fidel Valdez Ramos, Class of 1950
 - Former Cost Rican President Jose M. Figueres, Class of 1979
- 440 International Cadets have been accepted
- 46 Active International Cadets representing 38 countries
 - 14 Accepted into Class of 2018





Governing Legislation

- 162 countries invited to nominate for Class of 2018
- Countries invited to participate are selected by:
 - US State Department
 - US Department of Defense
- Each country can sponsor and nominate up to 6 candidates
- IAW P.L. 107-107 (Dec '02), USMA is authorized international cadet strength of 60 in USCC
- An individual country cannot have more than 3 cadets at USMA at any one time unless granted a waiver by OSD

West Point The United States Military Academy

Tuition

- US Law foreign countries must reimburse for tuition cost of approximately \$76,944.18 annually
- Secretary of Defense is authorized to grant tuition waivers in whole or in part:
 - Maximum of 20 full waivers at any one time
 - No limit on partial waivers which waive up to 66% of tuition
 - Tuition assistance determined by GNP of country
 - No waivers for World Bank "High Income Countries" (GNP greater than \$12,476)



Mission

To educate, train, and inspire the Corps of Cadets so that each graduate is a **commissioned** leader of character committed to the values of Duty, Honor, Country and prepared for a career of professional excellence and service









Requirements

- Must be <u>nominated</u> by foreign government official verified through United States Defense Attaché Office
- Requirements:
 - 17 to 22 years of age
 - Not married
 - Not pregnant and have any legal obligation to support a dependent












Admission Process

Admission Process

Academic

- High school or college academic transcripts
- SAT or ACT (Must take Writing)
- English proficiency on TOEFL

Leadership Potential

- Athletic activities
- Extracurricular activities
- Community participation
- Recommendations from school officials and USDAO

Physical and Medical

- Strength, endurance, and agility
- Cadet Fitness Assessment (6 events)
- Certificate from licensed medical physician (evaluating physical and mental health)



Timeline

September

- List of countries invited to participate <u>published</u> by OSD
- Message to USDAO citing <u>critical information</u> and <u>dates</u> in the admissions cycle
- Instructions and applications sent (via Email to USDAO)



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Timeline

31 January


- Suspense for receipt of all nominations

28 February

- Suspense for file completion

March

 File screened by English, Math, Foreign Language, and Physical Education
 Departments



Mid-April

- USDAOs are notified via mail and email of file results

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Timeline

Early May

Offered candidates notifies USMA to "accept or decline"

Mid-May

- "Admit packages" sent to USDAOs
 - Appointment certificates
 - Visa requests
 - Travel orders
 - Plane tickets
 - Orientation schedule

5-Days Prior to Reception Day

- Orientation (Welcome Dinner, Six Flags Trip, Briefings, Medical)
